Complete the 5 a day (see the separate document)

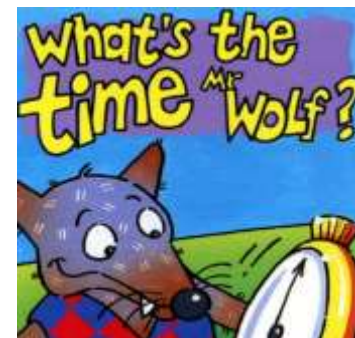


This week we are going to be thinking about time.
