Prepositions

Prepositions can be used at the beginning or end of a sentence.

Someone is hiding **behind** the snowman. **Behind** the snowman, someone is hiding.

I read books **with** my friends.

With my friends, I read books.

They followed the rabbit **in** the day.

In the day, they followed the rabbit.

She did not notice **because of** the book, **in** her hands.
